


Snowfall Crochet Along 2019 by Jessica Wifall

(Introduction)

snowflake /'snō flāk/ - noun - a flake of snow, especially a feathery ice crystal, typically displaying delicate six-fold symmetry



For this Crochet Along we will be making a dozen snowflakes. It will begin December 1st with two patterns, one will be a paid pattern, and one will be a free pattern. The next part will be released every 3 days, 1 paid and 1 free available for each release date.

To get the complete collection of all 12 patterns, you can purchase the eBook on Ravelry. It will also be available on Etsy starting December 16th, once all of the patterns have been released.

Size and Materials

Using size 10 crochet thread, the snowflakes measure between 3 to 6 inches from point to point and take between an approximate 7 to 16 yards of thread for each piece. The size of the snowflake, along with the approximate amount of thread it should require, is listed at the start of the individual patterns. Please keep in mind that these estimations are with my own personal crochet tension and both the size and amount of thread may vary a great deal with different crochet tension and use of different thread and appropriately sized hook.

To make all 12 of the snowflakes you will need approximately 120 yards of size 10 crochet thread. I have made most of my snowflakes in both [Aunt Lydia's Classic Cotton Crochet Thread Size 10](#), as well as [Scheepjes Sugar Rush](#). I have found that both work very well. The sizes and quantity of thread listed in the patterns are done with Aunt Lydia's Classic Cotton. Using Scheepjes Sugar Rush yarn, my snowflakes came out slightly smaller and softer.

You will also need:

- Crochet hook size 8 US or 1.5 mm (or hook that gives you a comfortable tension)
- Scissors
- Small tapestry needle
- fabric stiffener such as Aleene's Fabric Stiffener & Draping Liquid
- Rust proof pins (T-pins suggested) and blocking foam or cardboard for securing the snowflake

Gauge

Gauge is not particularly important for the snowflakes. However, **tension** can be very important, especially with a few snowflakes. Please read any special notes at the beginning of each of the individual patterns.
